BECAUSE YOU ASKED

Q Can my student still park in Lot 100 for class if there is an event going on?

Yes! They just need to have their permit barcode ready to show the attendants as they enter the lot. We recommend that they save a screenshot of it on their phone. There are also other Any Valid Permit Lots across campus (transport.tamu.edu/avpmap) if they are looking for other options!

Q What should my student do if the bus is full?

Aggie Spirit buses run every 5-20 minutes depending on the route. At peak times when the buses stack up and are full, they may pass a stop to get back on schedule and another bus will follow the full one. Your student can go to the Bus Routes section in the Texas A&M app for official real-time bus locations, capacities, and bus arrival times.

IMPROVEMENTS

COMPLETED ////

Throckmorton Street (12/13 – 1/10)

Concrete was replaced on Throckmorton at Joe Routt near the Corps of Cadets Center to enhance road conditions and improve drainage.

Jones Street (1/6 – 1/10)

We removed and replaced approximately 900 square feet of failing concrete around utility manholes.

COMING SOON ////

Penberthy Widening Project (Projected June 2025 – February 2026)

Plans are underway to widen Penberthy Blvd. from 2 lanes to 4 lanes of traffic from George Bush Dr. to John Kimbrough Blvd.

N Houston Street Multi-Use Path (Projected June 2025 – August 2025)

Plans feature redesigned paths to separate pedestrians from micromobility users, and cyclists to improve safety and flow.
